Tom Palmer is an Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Delaware where he directs the jazz ensembles, teaches drumset and piano, heads the jazz studies program, and performs with the Faculty Jazz Ensemble. Tom has performed with many jazz artists including Ernie Watts, Robin Eubanks, Herb Ellis and Donald Byrd. He has appeared in various jazz festivals including Wilmington's Jazz in the Village, The Clifford Brown Jazz Festival, and The Rehoboth Jazz Festival. Tom has recorded with Ernie Watts and Don Glanden as well as local artist Shawn Quaisanee. With his wife, jazz singer Ellen Lebowitz, he recorded and produced the jazz and popular standards albums: "Invitation To Yesterdays" and "Smokin' Aloud." Tom is a past president of the IAJE Delaware Chapter, a member of JEN and a frequent clinician.

Corin Overland is an Assistant Professor of Professional Practice in Music Education at the University of Miami Frost School of Music, where he teaches courses in choral conducting, choral literature and secondary choral methods. Overland received a Ph.D. in Music Education from Temple University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where he held teaching and research assistantship positions. Overland holds an M.M. in Choral Conducting from the University of Missouri at Kansas City, and a B.A. in Music Education from Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minnesota. Dr. Overland has taught choral music at the secondary level for 14 years in Minnesota, Maryland, and Missouri, and holds multiple teaching certifications in choral, instrumental and general music. Prior to beginning his doctoral work, he was the Director of Choral Music at Punahou Academy in Honolulu, Hawaii—the nation’s largest private school. He frequently appears as guest conductor and clinician for local and national events, serving most recently as the conductor of All-State Jr. Honor Choirs in Oregon. His research interests include the history of music education organizations; integrated-arts school reform models; and the effects of musical training on physical coordination and timing. He has presented research nationally and internationally, and is published in the *Journal of Research in Historical Music Education* and the *Music Educator’s Journal*.

**Karen Kennedy—Guest Conductor**

**Lori Geckle—Accompanist**



Praised by the San Francisco Classical Voice for her “wizardry with voices” and named by the Honolulu Star Bulletin as “. . . a popular and charismatic leader,” Karen Kennedy has recently joined the faculty at the University of Miami as Director of Choral Studies. Before joining the arts community in South Florida, she held the positions of Chorus Director for the Honolulu Symphony, Artistic Director for the Hawai`i International Choral Festival, Director of Choral Activities at the University of Hawai`i at Manoa, and Director of Choral Activities at Towson University. A recipient of the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in choral music from Arizona State University, Dr. Kennedy also earned a Master of Music in choral conducting from Butler University and a Bachelor of Music Education from DePauw University.

During her time in Hawai`i, Dr. Kennedy regularly conducted the Honolulu Symphony Orchestra and Chorus in performance, and has also worked with the Miami Symphony Orchestra, the Boca Raton Philharmonic, and the New England Symphonic Ensemble as well as large festival choirs in venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Mormon Tabernacle in Salt Lake City, Utah, St. Peter’s Basilica in Vatican City, Italy, the Royal Academy of Music in Stockholm, Sweden, Ely Cathedral in Ely, England, Southwark Cathedral in London, England, and Greyfriar’s Kirke in Edinburgh, Scotland. She also enjoyed a residency at Stanford University as Conductor for the Stanford University Summer Chorus Festival.

In addition, Dr. Kennedy is well known as a choral clinician and adjudicator, regularly working with Gateway Music Festivals, Music in the Parks, and

Heritage Music Tours. She is also a popular honor choir clinician, having served as conductor of All-State and Festival Honor Choirs in Minnesota, Colorado, North Carolina, Oregon, Hawai`i, Florida, Nevada, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Maryland.

In addition to regular podium performances, Dr. Kennedy enjoys the opportunity to present workshops on choral repertoire, conducting, choral pedagogy and vocal pedagogy. Her workshops have been a part of recent ACDA and MENC regional and state conventions.

Dr. Kennedy has received numerous awards for teaching, including the University of Hawai`i Chancellor’s Citation for Meritorious Teaching, Arizona State University’s Manzanita “Top Prof” Award, Butler University’s Faculty Distinction Award, and is a two-time recipient of the Lawrence Township Schools Superintendent’s Award.

Dr. Kennedy remains active in several professional organizations, having served as the ACDA Eastern Division Collegiate Repertoire and Standards Chair, as President of the Hawai`i chapter of the American Choral Directors Association, and as a founding member of the National Collegiate Choral Organization.

Paul Rardin joined the faculty of Temple University as director of choral activities in 2011. He conducts the Concert Choir, teaches graduate conducting, and oversees the six-choir program at Temple's Boyer College of Music and Dance. He previously taught at the University of Michigan and Towson University, where his choirs appeared with the Kirov Orchestra of the Mariinsky Theatre, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, and Baltimore Choral Arts Society. Under his direction the University of Michigan Men's Glee Club performed at the 2010 American Choral Directors Central Division Convention.

Rardin has served as a guest conductor for all-state choirs in twelve states, for divisional honor choirs for the ACDA and Music Educators National Conference, and for Manhattan Concert Productions at Lincoln Center. He has presented clinics for state, regional, and national conferences of the American Choral Directors Association. His engagements for 2012-2013 include the Delaware All-State Mixed Chorus, Illinois ACDA SATB Adult Honor Choir, Pennsylvania District 11 High School Chorus, ACDA Maryland/DC Mid-Atlantic Collegiate Choral Conference, and Texas Choral Directors Association Convention.

Rardin is a graduate of Williams College and the University of Michigan, where he received the M.M. in composition and the D.M.A. in conducting. He has studied conducting with Theodore Morrison, Jerry Blackstone, and Gustav Meier, and composition with Leslie Bassett, George Wilson, and Robert Suderburg. He has also participated in conducting master classes with Helmuth Rilling, Charles Bruffy, and Dale Warland. His arrangements of spirituals and folk songs are published by Santa Barbara Music Publishing, and his articles, many on the

topic of contemporary music, have appeared in the ACDA publications Choral Journal, Troubadour, Resound, and Bel Canto.

Rardin lives in suburban Philadelphia with his wife, Sandy.

## 2013 Delaware All-State Junior Band Wesley Broadnax—Guest Conductor



Wesley J. Broadnax joins the faculty of Drexel University as Visiting Assistant Professor of Music & Director of Bands for the 2012-2013 academic year. His duties include conducting the Concert Band, Chamber Winds, and the Pep Band. Prior to Drexel, Dr. Broadnax served as Director of Bands/Instrumental Music Education on the faculties of the University of Delaware, California State University East Bay, and Michigan State University.

A native of Texas, Dr. Broadnax received his bachelor's degree in music education from Stephen F. Austin State University and taught for several years in the Texas Public Schools. He received both the master's and doctoral degrees in Wind Conducting from Michigan State University. While at Michigan State University, he was a regular performer on bass trombone and euphonium, where he was a member of the West Shore Symphony, Greater Lansing Symphony, Grand Rapids Symphony, Jackson Symphony, Kalamazoo Symphony, and Midland Symphony, in addition to various chamber ensembles that included both the West Shore Symphony Brass Trio and Capitol Brass Quartet in Lansing. In California, he performed as bass trombonist with the Silicon Valley Symphony and Mission Chamber Orchestra. His conducting teachers include John L. Whitwell and Frank L. Battisti; his bass trombone/euphonium teachers have included Nathaniel Brickens, Curtis R. Olson, Philip Sinder, J. Mark Thompson, and William Young.

Dr. Broadnax maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator. He has conducted several All-State and honor bands both nationally and internationally, having most recently conducted throughout Central Italy in August 2012 (Bandas di Norcia e Bevagna), and has presented resident conducting seminars at Michigan State University, University of Alaska-Fairbanks,

Indiana State University, Bemidji State University, and St. Ambrose University. He has served as guest conductor for both the 56th Annual Stanislaus County Junior High School Music Festival in Modesto, Calif., and the Fresno-Madera Counties Music Educators Association in Reedley, Calif. He adjudicated the Western Band Association Concert Band Festival in Atherton, Calif., and conducted the Rocky Mountain Honour Band in Calgary, Alberta (Canada). He is a strong advocate of new music and has won the praises of several composers and the premieres of their works, including David Maslanka, Michael Weinstein, Dana Wilson, Jere Hutcheson, Paul Barsom, Davide Zannoni, Lawrence Singer, Joel Puckett, Nicholas Vasallo, and Stephen Rush. He participated in the Pierre Boulez Symposium on 20th Century Contemporary Music at Carnegie Hall in New York City, the focal work being the composer's *Le marteau sans maître*, with members of Ensemble Intercontemporain. In the summer of 2002, Dr. Broadnax completed a four-week residency as a conducting fellow at the Boston University Tanglewood Institute, where he co-conducted the Young Artists Wind Ensemble and Chamber Music Program with master teacher Frank L. Battisti. In addition, Dr. Broadnax served as guest conductor for the Greater Lansing Symphony Orchestra Children's concert series in Spring 2005 titled "The Circle of Life," as part of its Black History Celebration. He also served for three years as music director/conductor for the Lansing Concert Band, and two seasons for the Oakland Municipal Band (California).

Scholarship & Research activities include presentations at the Conductors Guild National Conference (Chicago), Delaware Music Educators Association (Smyrna, DE), and published articles on a variety of topics related to music education, including a recent article titled Ensemble Intonation: Five Strategies for Long-Term Improvement for the School Band & Orchestra Magazine (SBO).

Dr. Broadnax holds professional membership with the Conductors Guild, College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA), California Music Educators Association (CMEA), Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association (MS-BOA), and the International Trombone Association (ITA), and he is an honorary member of Kappa Kapp Psi, Tau Beta Sigma, Phi Mu Alpha and Pi Kappa Lambda organizations.

## 2013 Delaware All-State Senior Band Samuel Hazo—Guest Conductor



Born in 1966, Samuel R. Hazo resides in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania with his wife and children. In 2003, Mr. Hazo became the first composer in history to be awarded the winner of both composition contests sponsored by the National Band Association. He has composed for the professional, university and public school levels in addition to writing original scores for television, radio and the stage. His original symphonic compositions include performances with actors Brooke Shields, James Earl Jones, David Conrad and Richard Kiley. In 2012, two of Mr. Hazo's compositions were used in the London Summer Olympic Games. On the Internet, Mr. Hazo's music has compiled over two million hits on YouTube. His compositions have been performed and recorded world-wide, including performances by the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra (national tour), the Birmingham Symphonic Winds (UK) and the Klavier Wind Project's recordings with Eugene Migliaro Corporon. Additionally, numerous titles of Mr. Hazo's works are included in the series "Teaching Music Through Performance in Band." He has served as composer-in-residence at Craig Kirckhoff's University of Minnesota Conducting Symposium and has also lectured on music and music education at universities and high schools internationally. In 2004, Mr. Hazo's compositions were listed in a published national survey of the "Top Twenty Compositions of All Time" for wind band. He is a member of ASCAP and recipient of multiple ASCAP Plus Awards.

Mr. Hazo has been a music teacher at every educational grade level from kindergarten through college, including tenure as a high school and university director. He has been asked to guest conduct over 50 university ensembles and, as of 2013, 16 All-State bands. Mr. Hazo was twice named "Teacher of Distinction" by the southwestern Pennsylvania Teachers' Excellence Foundation. He received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Duquesne University where he served on

the Board of Governors and was awarded as Duquesne's Outstanding Graduate in Music Education. Mr. Hazo serves as a lecturer and clinician for Hal Leonard Corporation. He is also sponsored by Sibelius Music Software.

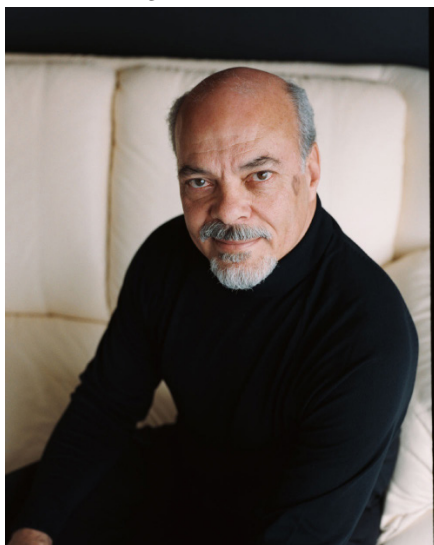

**William LaRue Jones—Guest Conductor**



William LaRue Jones is “one of the most active and versatile symphonic conductors in America today, possessing a unique ability to work effectively with musicians at all levels of performing capability and experience” (Minneapolis Star-Tribune). His conducting schedule includes a wide array of professional, festival, collegiate and student ensembles throughout North America, Latin America, Europe and Asia, ranging from the Minnesota Orchestra and the Minneapolis Pops, to the Penang (Malaysia) Symphony, the Orquestra Sinfonica do Theatro da Paz (Belem, Brazil), the Antofagasta (Chile) Symphony and the Symphony Orchestra of Lucerne (Switzerland).

Recent conducting engagements include orchestras in Illinois, Wisconsin, New York, Ohio, Minnesota, Arizona, Delaware, Maryland, Nebraska and Florida, as well as concerts in Singapore, Kuala Lumpur and Penang, Malaysia, Belem, Brazil, Wuhan, Shijiazhuang and Liaoning, China. He was appointed ‘Honorable Visiting Professor’ of Shenyang Normal University (China) and returns annually to conduct and present master classes. In addition, Jones has conducted over 100 All-State orchestras with additional festival/clinics in each of the 50 states and Canadian provinces.

As a professional performer noted for his outstanding technique and musicality, Jones was principle bassoon of the Minnesota Opera and Minnesota Ballet, and was first call associate with the Minnesota Orchestra and Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra for over 15 seasons. He has performed under such esteemed maestros as Stanislaw Skrowaczewski, Klaus Tennstedt, Antol Dorati, Charles Dutoit, Aaron Copland, Zubin Mehta, Neville Marriner, Edo deWaart, and Leonard Slatkin, to

name a few.

Since 1997, Jones has been Professor of Music and Director of Orchestral Studies and conductor of orchestras and opera at The University of Iowa (Iowa City). In 2011, Dr. Jones received the distinct honor of becoming a Collegiate Fellow in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. In 2008/9, the State of Iowa and the University of Iowa selected Dr. Jones for the Regents Award for Faculty Excellence. He was also designated an Obermann Scholar and a Stanley International Fellow in 2008.

He has held the position of Music Director/Conductor of the Oshkosh Symphony Orchestra, and Music Director/Conductor of the Bloomington Symphony Orchestra. He holds the titles of Founder and Conductor Laureate of Greater Twin Cities' Youth Symphonies (MN), and Conductor Emeritus of the 3M Symphony.

Recognition of Jones' outstanding gestural skills and score analysis has made him a sought-after teacher of conducting. He was a member of the conducting faculty of the International Workshops where he also served as conductor of the International String Orchestra, and is founding Artistic Director of the critically acclaimed Conductors Workshop of America. In addition, Jones is a guest clinician for numerous conducting seminars for professional/educational associations internationally.

In 1972, Dr. Jones founded the Greater Twin Cities' Youth Symphonies (MN) which he guided to international acclaim during a 25-year tenure. The program became a model for youth symphony structures world-wide, comprised of eight full orchestras involving over 1000 students annually.

For his untiring work on behalf of music and arts education, he has been honored with the David W. Preuss Leadership award, the American String Teachers Associations Exceptional Leadership and Merit Award, the Sigma Alpha Iota Musician of the Year Award, WCCO Radio "Good Neighbor Award" and the State of Minnesota Governors' Proclamation of "Dr. William LaRue Jones Day."

A Texas native, Dr. Jones holds degrees from the University of Wisconsin, University of Iowa and Kansas State University, with additional studies at The Juilliard School of Music and the University of North Texas.

# Tips to Share with Parents

## The Many Benefits of Music Education

Schools that have music programs have significantly higher graduation rates than those without music programs (90.2 percent compared to 72.9 percent).

On average, students in music performance scored 57 points higher on the verbal and 41 points higher on the math section of the SAT than did students with no music participation.



Parents wield extraordinary influence over local principals, school boards, and other decision makers. Encourage them to become involved in the advocacy process and make a significant difference in the quality of their child's music education program.

Here are some simple, time-effective ways parents can assist their child's school music educators:

#### Access the Status Quo

- Study the ways that music education develops creativity, enhances cooperative learning, instills disciplined work habits, and statistically correlates with gains in standardized test scores.
- Speak with your local school board about your desire to have a strong music education for your child.
- Find out if music classes in your schools are taught by teachers certified in the arts; see to it that arts specialists are required by policy.

#### Communicate Effectively

- Speak at meetings of your school board about the importance of supporting music education with funds for teacher training, equipment and supplies, and music-related activities.
- Be in touch with local music teachers on a regular basis.
- Ask yourself why your children need high quality music education. Be able to articulate the answers to teachers, administrators, and other parents.
- Take part in your school's music booster organization.
- Make certain that your local media give adequate coverage to the accomplishments of your school's music program.
