Alan C. McClung joined the University of North Texas College of Music faculty in 2002. He teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in choral conducting, secondary choral methods, including Up Front!, UNT's eighty-voice pedagogical choir for music education, and supervises student teachers. With a Ph.D. in Music Education from Florida State University, Dr. McClung's professional experience includes teaching and conducting at all levels. In addition to six European concert tours, his middle, upper, and college choirs include numerous invited performances for a variety of state and regional music conferences. He has conducted a variety of state and regional honor choirs and has served as guest conductor for the award winning Landesjungenchor from Koblenz, Germany. As chorister and soloist, Dr. McClung spent three seasons singing with the Atlanta Symphony Chorus and Chamber Chorus under the direction of Robert Shaw.

An active member of ACDA and NAFME, he served as a national delegate to ACDA's International Conductor Exchange with Germany and Sweden, Georgia's Music Educator's State Choral Chair, Missouri's ACDA Repertoire and Standards Chair for Colleges and Universities, and the R & S Chair for Southwest ACDA's Student and Youth Activities. As a distinguished choral music educator, he is invited frequently to present at state, divisional, and national music conferences. Additional presentations include master classes at Roehampton University, London, England. Articles by Dr. McClung have appeared in *Southeastern Journal of Music Education*, ACDA's *Choral Journal*, MENC's *Music Educators Journal*, *Update: Applications of Research in Music Education*, and *Journal of Research in Music Education*. He is author of *Movable Tonic: A Sequenced Sight-Singing Method*, a GIA publication, and he is director of the Cambiata Institute of America for Early Adolescent Vocal Music, established on the campus of the University of North

Texas in 2009. In 2015, he was named the new managing editor for the publishing company, Cambiata Press. A UNT Honors Professor, he is the conference chair and host for the Third MS/JH National Conference for Choral Music, May 6 and 7, 2016.

Cindy L. Bell is Associate Professor of Music Education at Hofstra University on Long Island, where she also directs the University Choir. This appointment follows an eight year position at the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College, CUNY. She teaches graduate and undergraduate music education courses, supervises student teachers and is director of the Master of Arts in Music Education program.

Passionate about the community that is created by choral singing, Dr. Bell infuses her students with both energy and vitality to achieve their individual potential and deliver dynamic performances. Recent conducting appearances include Pennsylvania (PMEA) Regional Chorus, All County Choirs in Nassau and Westchester, NY, and the Long Island Music Festival. Dr. Bell is a regular conductor at one of the largest sacred choral gatherings on the East Coast - a choir of 1000 singers – at the Annual Choir Festival in her hometown of Ocean Grove, NJ. Her varied choral experiences include singing with Fred Waring, Donald Neuen, Robert Shaw, Gregg Smith, John Rutter, Anton Armstrong and Simon Carrington. Dr. Bell is a specialist in choral music education and teacher training, presenting clinics and workshops at state, divisional and national music education and choral conferences, including NYSSMA; NAFME Eastern Division 2003, 2005 and 2009 Conferences; NAFME 2004, 2010 and 2014 National In-Service Conferences; ACDA 2004, 2006, 2010 and 2012 Eastern Division Conventions; ACDA 2007 National Convention; and ISME 2002 Rotterdam and 2008 Rome Community

Music Seminars. Recent published articles on such topics as community choirs and singing, choral rehearsing and student teaching appear in music education journals the International Journal of Community Music, Choral Journal, Music Educators Journal, International Journal of Research in Choral Singing, Bulletin for the Council of Research in Music Education, Journal of Music Teacher Education, and conference proceedings for ISME Community Music Seminars.

She has previously taught public school choral music, produced musical theatre, directed church choirs, and is busy as a guest conductor for choir festivals, from youth through adult singers. From 1996 to 2010, Dr. Bell directed the Mariners Chorus at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, NY, one of the nation's five federal academies. Dr. Bell earned a Bachelor of Arts degree Magna Cum Laude from Lycoming College (Williamsport, PA), a Master of Music degree in choral conducting at the Eastman School of Music, University of Rochester (NY), and a Doctorate in Education from Teachers College, Columbia University, NY.

Dr. Paul Hondorp is Director of Choral Activities and Associate Professor of Music at Western Kentucky University, where he leads an active choral program and teaches at the undergraduate and graduate level. Dr. Hondorp has served as an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor throughout the United States and abroad. His recent professional activity includes guest clinicianships and conducting in Singapore, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Honduras, Vancouver and California. He also serves as Director of Music at First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Bowling Green, KY, and has been involved in church music for over 20 years. Dr. Hondorp is president-elect of the Kentucky Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. A lyric tenor, Dr. Hondorp performs regularly with the Dallas-based professional chamber choir Vox Humana. His professional recording credits include ensemble performances with the Oregon Bach Festival Chorus (Haydn Theresienmesse, Hänslers), Vox Humana (Into the Night: Contemporary Choral Music, Naxos – Grammy Nominated), the Hot Springs Music Festival (The Music of Edmund Dédé, Naxos), and an educational series of compact discs by GIA Publications. His workbook and compact disc *Choral Error Detection: Exercises for Developing Musicianship*, is published by Carl Fischer Music.

## 2016 Delaware All-State Orchestra Jean Montès—Guest Conductor



Dr. Jean Montès is an accomplished conductor, educator, clinician, lecturer, and performer based in Louisiana. He is the Director of Orchestral Studies and Coordinator of Strings at Loyola University in New Orleans, where he conducts orchestral ensembles and teaches conducting and string pedagogy courses for music education majors. In addition to his responsibilities at Loyola University, Montès is the Artistic Director of The Greater New Orleans Youth Orchestra (GNOYO) where conducts the Symphony Orchestra.

In recent years, Montès has held orchestral leadership positions at Virginia Commonwealth University, St. Ambrose University, the University of Iowa, and with the Waynesboro Symphony Orchestra, the Bay Youth Orchestras of Virginia, and the Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies.

Montès was born in Port-Au-Prince, Haiti. He later studied the cello at the Holy Trinity School of Music. He left Haiti after winning a full scholarship to pursue his bachelor's degree in cello performance at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA. He then received an assistantship at the University of Akron in Ohio where he also earned his masters in music education. He completed his Doctorate of Musical Arts in orchestral conducting at the University of Iowa under the tutelage of Dr. William LaRue Jones. His dissertation topic is An Annotated Translation from French to English of the History of Music in Haiti. He is presently focusing his research on the performance and promotion of orchestral works by Haitian composers.

A musician and conductor who enthusiastically promotes music of all world cultures, Dr. Montès is in constant demand as a conductor, clinician, judge and lecturer with orchestras and schools at all levels throughout the country. His unique

approach to repertoire selection and rehearsal techniques enables him to connect, to be effective and admired by audiences and musicians of all ages. Most recent appearances include guest conducting the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, The Richmond Symphony Orchestra, and the Cedar Rapids Symphony Orchestra, giving clinics in Las Vegas and at the Midwest Clinic and performances of Mozart's *The Magic Flute* with the VCU Opera Theatre. He enjoys collaborating with organizations representing the full spectrum of the arts. Montès led an orchestra in a sold out performance of Prokofiev's *Romeo and Juliet Ballet* in collaboration with the Metropolitan Ballet project in the Twin Cities. Additionally, he was appointed by the mayor of Minneapolis to serve as the 2004 Co-Chair of Minneapolis Mosaic, a summer project which celebrates and showcases the talents of over 150 culturally diverse artistic and performance groups from the Minneapolis area.

## 2016 Delaware All-State Junior Band Deborah Confredo—Guest Conductor



Deborah Confredo (formerly Sheldon) is Professor and Director of Graduate Programs in Music Education in the Boyer College of Music and Dance at Temple University. Founder of Temple's Night Owls Campus/Community Band, Confredo's specialties include instrumental rehearsal techniques and teaching methods, conducting, wind band literature, community bands, and informal music learning. Dr. Confredo has taught elementary and secondary instrumental music in Pennsylvania and New York. She has co-authored the texts *The Complete Woodwind Instructor: A Guidebook for the Music Educator* and *Lessons in Performance* (FJH), and is editor of *Superior Bands in Sixteen Weeks*, and *Chorales and Rhythmic Etudes for Superior Bands*. An instrumental editor, arranger, author, and consultant for the FJH Music Company, she is lead author for the FJH publication *Measures of Success*<sup>®</sup>, a multi-level band method for beginning and intermediate instrumentalists. She developed and is featured in the *Measures of Success*<sup>®</sup> *Video Practice Buddy Series*, an online video tutorial program for developing band musicians. She partners with the leadership of Associazione Nazionale Bande Italiane Musicali Autonome (AN-BIMA) Piemonte in Italy towards the continued development of band musicians in schools and communities. Her numerous academic articles are published in journals such as the *Journal for Research in Music Education*, *Bulletin of the Council for Research in Music Education (CRME)*, *Update: Applications of Research in Music Education*, *Journal for Music Teacher Education*, *Journal of Music Therapy*, *Music Educators Journal*, *Journal of Band Research*, *The Instrumentalist*, and *Contributions to Music Education*, as well as in several state music education journals. A past editor of the *Bulletin of the Council for Research in Music Education*, Confredo has also served multiple terms as an editorial board member for that journal as well as the *Journal of Research in Music Education*. She is currently an editorial board member

for the journals *Education*, *Journal of Research in Music Performance*, and the *International Journal of Music Education*, and ad hoc reviewer for *Frontiers in Psychology*, an open-access online journal. She serves on the Executive Committee for the Society for Research in Music Education under the auspices of the National Association for Music Education. Dr. Confredo is in demand as clinician, adjudicator, guest conductor, and lecturer. Tau Beta Sigma and the Illinois Music Educators Association have honored her for distinguished service to music and music education, and Mansfield University has recognized her as a distinguished alumnus. Confredo plays saxophones and keyboards in the South Jersey/Philadelphia-based classic-rock cover band, *Nasty Habits* and the *West River Drive* jazz quartet.

Here are some simple, time-effective ways parents can assist their child's school music educators:

### Access the Status Quo

- Study the ways that music education develops creativity, enhances cooperative learning, instills disciplined work habits, and statistically correlates with gains in standardized test scores.
- Speak with your local school board about your desire to have a strong music education for your child.
- Find out if music classes in your schools are taught by teachers certified in the arts; see to it that arts specialists are required by policy.

### Communicate Effectively

- Speak at meetings of your school board about the importance of supporting music education with funds for teacher training, equipment and supplies, and music-related activities.
- Be in touch with local music teachers on a regular basis.
- Ask yourself why your children need high quality music education. Be able to articulate the answers to teachers, administrators, and other parents.
- Take part in your school's music booster organization.
- Make certain that your local media give adequate coverage to the accomplishments of your school's music program.

## 2016 Delaware All-State Senior Band Kraig Alan Williams—Guest Conductor



Dr. Kraig Alan Williams is currently the director of bands, associate professor of music, and director of the wind studies program at the Mason Gross School of the Arts, Rutgers University. His duties include the artistic guidance of the Grammy-nominated Rutgers Wind Ensemble and administration of the university band program. Other responsibilities include teaching graduate and undergraduate conducting and mentoring of masters and doctoral students in wind studies.

Williams has appeared as a guest conductor, clinician, and lecturer in more than 15 states and with ensembles such as the Dallas Wind Symphony and the United States Air Force Band. Williams has led concerts before the College Band Director's National Association Southern Regional Conference (2006, 2010), Tennessee All-West Concert Band Festival (2005), the Mid-South Low Brass Conference (2007), and the Mid-South Horn Conference (2009). His wind ensemble was featured in several Mid-South Imagine Contemporary Music Festivals. The ensemble played the works of composers such as Joseph Schwantner, George Crumb, James Mobberley, Armando Luna, Hasan Ucarusu, Eric Whitacre, Michael Daugherty, and David Maslanka.

Prior to arriving at Rutgers, Williams served as the director of bands at University of Memphis (2003-2011); conductor of the Duke University Wind

Symphony and director of the Duke in Vienna program (1997-2000); director of bands and chamber ensembles at California State University, Los Angeles (1993-1996); assistant conductor of Southern California Inland Empire Symphony and Los Angeles Solo Repertoire Orchestra in Burbank (1990-1993); and music director of the Lake Elsinore Civic Light Opera (1990-1993).

Williams has conducted performances in Graz, Budapest, Malta, Marktoberdorf, and Prague. He has performed in Carnegie Hall, conducted live radio broadcasts on National Public Radio and has recorded for Mark Records and ADK in Prague, Czech Republic. A project featuring the wind music of Eric Ewazen was also released on Albany records in 2011.

Williams received his doctorate from The University of Texas at Austin, where he studied with Jerry F. Junkin. He received a master of music degree in performance from California State University, Northridge. Williams is a member of CBDNA, TMEA, and is a sponsor and honorary member of the Memphis chapters of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.

Williams joined the conducting faculty at the Brevard Music Center in 2001 and was named director of band activities in 2008.
